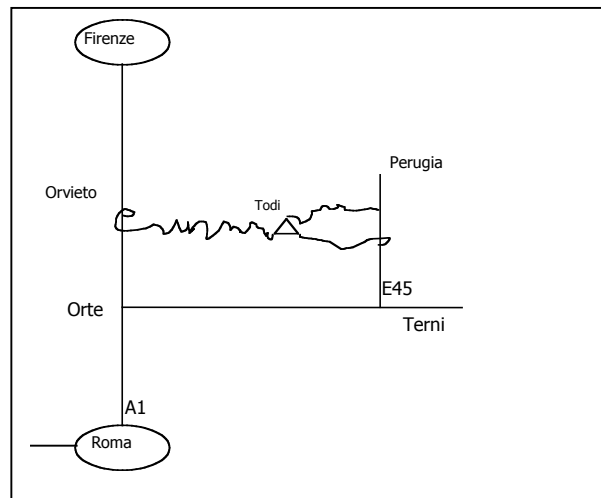


DIRECTIONS TO BORGO TORREAGENTILE

From Rome Airport to Todi:

- Leaving airport, follow signs to Roma
- At the circle road, follow signs to Firenze – not Naples. This puts you on the ring road going north around Rome
- Continue to follow signs for the A1 to Firenze. Eventually this will be an exit off the circular road.
- Head north on the A1 toward Firenze. Exit at Orte. A1 becomes a toll road and there will be a toll at Orte for about €4
- From Orte follow signs for Terni – this will take you East.
- As you get closer to Terni you will pick up signs for Perugia. Take the exit for Perugia onto route E45.
- Stay on E45 until you see an exit for Todi – go up the steep hill, then take a left to stop sign, then right to Todi.



(If you are going into Rome prior to coming to Todi, there is a direct train from the airport to Termini Station in Rome; trains leave about every 20 minutes. If you are meeting people in Todi who already have a car, there is a bus from the international Terminal C to Perugia that stops at Todi. If you rent a car at the airport be sure they give you the piece of paper needed to get out of the garage.)

Buses to/from Todi and Rome and Rome airport:

If you have of public transportation to/from Rome or the Rome airport, there is a bus that goes from the airport to an API gas station in Pian di Porto (just outside Todi, across E45, past Ponte Rio). The schedules for the buses (as well as those into Rome) can be found on www.sulga.it. This is only a good idea if you have someone in Todi with a car already.

From Perugia Airport to Todi

Perugia/Edigio is a small airport with connecting flights to Milano. You can generally check your bags through to Perugia. There are car rental places at Perugia but you must reserve in advance since the desks are not usually occupied. (Double check in advance because the car rental places in Perugia are not always operating on weekends.) The Perugia airport is small and the drive there takes you through rural fields that do not look like a typical approach to an airport. It is an easy drive from Perugia to Todi. This is definitely the preferable option – assuming you verify the car pickup or make a connection in Milano.

- Exit airport and turn right. Follow signs for the E45 toward Perugia (not toward Assisi).
- Once on a highway merge left and carefully follow signs for E45 south toward Rome or Terni. (will bear a bit left)
- Stay on the E45 past Perugia exits, past Deruta, past exit for Montecastella di Vibio (visit these later) and take the exit for Todi
- At the end of the exit ramp turn L toward Todi; stay on this road through Ponte Rio, past the flower market on your left, staying on the road up the winding hill to the stop sign – turn right. This puts you on the road past stores that eventually becomes “Roma Road” right up to the town walls -- so you can follow the directions from Todi to Torregentile above.

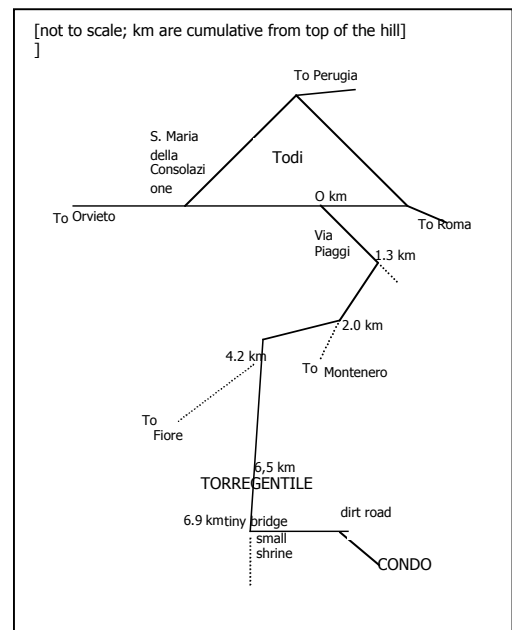
From Firenze To Todi

If you fly to Firenze/Florence then follow the A1 south toward Rome. Take the exit for Perugia, follow it to Perugia; you will go under a series of several tunnels. Just past one of these take the right exit for E45 toward Terni.

- Stay on the E45 past Perugia exits, past Deruta, past exit for Montecastella di Vibio (visit these later) and take the exit for Todi
- At the end of the exit ramp turn L toward Todi; stay on this road through Ponte Rio, past the flower market on your left, staying on the road up the winding hill to the stop sign – turn right. This puts you on the road past stores that eventually becomes “Roma Road” right up to the town walls -- so you can follow the directions from Todi to Torregentile above.

From Todi to Borgo Torregentile:

- If you enter from the South (road changes names, called Roma when close to Todi wall), you eventually come to a **T** and traffic light at the city gate/walls. At the light, take a left and follow along the old medieval city walls for 0.5km. You will pass the farmacia on your left, when you will reach the next fortification tower on your right, take a sharp left down a very typically Roman straight steep road – via Piaggi.
- At the bottom of the hill (1.3km), take a right at the stop sign, following signs toward the Piscina and toward Fiori. Follow this road past the Piscina area and keep a lookout for a road going off to the right with signs for Fiori and Torregentile (among others) (0.7km)
- Follow this over hill and dale and around fields; eventually (2.2km) you will reach other road signs that show Fiori veering off to the right and Torregentile to the left. [If you reach Fiori you missed this intersection. If traveling at night take care at this intersection as the sign for Torregentile is the only one that does not reflect – don’t know why.]
- Follow the left fork toward Torregentile. (2.3km). As you enter Torregentile, you will drive between stone houses that allow just enough space for one car to pass.
- Shortly past that (0.4 km) you will go over a small bridge (just railings on the road indicating you are going over a stream), then on your left will be a dumpster then a dirt road and a shrine inset in the wall at the corner. Take a left here and follow the dirt road down to a large stone building – this is Borgo Torregentile.
- There is a gravel parking lot on your right – I have the two parking spaces 6th and 7th from your immediate right. The parking spaces are very narrow so you may want to unpack before edging into one of the spaces.



Casa di Anne: Unit 2N:

- There are two large Umbrian stone buildings. Go down the stone pathway between the buildings and up the 6 or so stairs directly in front of you – this is unit 2N. There is a sign on the door “Casa di Anne”.
- If you don’t have keys, contact Patricia Antonini, in the farmhouse just beyond the building. You may need a letter from me to give to Patricia to get access to the unit.
- The key turns to the left to open.
